Health Correspondent Intro

Berners Rock the AKC Temperament Test

BMDCNV hosted an AKC Temperament Test on October 1, the first BMD club to do so. This is a new type of trial that tests the dogs on a variety of stimuli: social, auditory, visual, tactile, proprioceptive, and unexpected stimulus. It seeks desirable traits including emotional stability, inquisitiveness, cooperation, biddability and a swift recovery after being startled. The Berners, in true Berner style, really did a fabulous job in all categories. The event was open to all breeds, and we had a few other breeds join us.

The day had many successes with a 90% pass rate for BMDs and 70% for the other breeds.

Our participants were Regina Helfer with Nor and Acadia, Kate Elders with River, Laurie Brown with Porschia, Celeste O'Malley with Braeburn, Lisa Freed with Tessie, Carolyn Massey with Grant, Jeanne Robbins with Boomah, Tina Sirico with Fennel, Cathy Sullivan-Neves with Eragon, Lisa Bergeron with Zeus, Rita Trojanoski with Marcepan, Candace Wright with Danis, Ivy Gregory with Grace—age 13!!, Kiera and Sitka, Amanda Wescott with five of hers, Ari, Dia, Moolah, Meiomi and Paloma, and myself with four, Wynter, Revvy, Icelyn, and Dez.

The day had many successes with a 90% pass rate for BMDs and 70% for the other breeds. This statistic just shows how our breed trusts their handlers and how trusting we are of our dogs' ability to navigate an unknown and challenging environment. The day did not come without some comedic handler errors (I wiped out on an obstacle, but Grant pounced on me to save the day - good dog!). We also have to give a big shout out to Ivy Gregory for coming with her dogs and having all three pass, with particular love and affection for Grace who, at 13, stole our judges' hearts. You see old dogs can do new tricks.

And lastly a huge thank you to Candace Wright and Kristi Adams for the very long day of judging; my volunteers Matt & Melissa George for a tireless day from dawn to dusk; and Laurie Brown, Celeste O'Malley, Richard Wright, and Amanda Wescott for volunteering in between running their dogs.

"Two Days, Two Weeks, Two Months" by Nancy Hoyt

I decided to write about Polycystic Kidney Disease both as a Health Awareness article and as therapy for me. In all the years of owning and raising Bernese Mountain Dogs (since 1996), I had never encountered this disease and feel it's worth sharing with members and friends of the BMDCNV.

When Edison was a young puppy, he drank a lot of water. Not having had a male in 15 years, I assumed Edison was more active and required more fluids. His appetite was strong until it wasn't, and then he started vomiting, a little at first and then more here and there. One morning I was confronted with vomit that covered my hallway and kitchen in one solid mass—I was aghast and panicked. Edison was rushed to the vet and shortly afterwards driven to Deerfield, MA for an ultrasound.

In September of 2021 Edison, our 13-monthold Bernese Mountain puppy was diagnosed with incurable Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). The ultrasound exam indicated two enlarged, abnormally shaped kidneys covered with cysts. His blood pressure was high and subsequent blood tests revealed that his Blood Urea Nitrogen (BUN) and Creatinine levels were off the charts indicating kidney failure. *Edison was given two days, two weeks, or two months*.

We were numb and heartbroken... There are no words to describe this moment. I called Heidi (Henderson) his breeder to share the news and we just sobbed in utter disbelief.

Edison was placed on the recommended "Science Diet for Kidney Disease," a low protein diet. He did amazingly well, rebounded, gained back all the weight he had lost in one weekend, and his test results revealed significant improvements. We were all thrilled with his progress—he was back and energetic as ever! The vet scheduled periodic check-ups to test his levels. The first few evaluations were good, but then slowly the creatinine levels began to rise. Fortunately, Edison never showed signs of the kidney impairment indicated by the abnormal tests. We were so blessed to have eight more wonderful months with him. In the second week of May 2022, he began to crash. We knew it was time... Edison passed away on May 25th with us by his side. *****



What Is Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD)?

PKD is an incurable, inherited condition in which large clusters of renal cysts develop in the kidneys and over time cause them to lose function. PKD is common in cats but uncommon in dogs. Dogs who receive only one defective copy (autosomal dominant) of the gene from either one of their parents may show signs of the disease.

The breeds most commonly diagnosed with PKD are Bull Terriers, Cairn Terriers and West Highland White Terriers. According to Berner-Garde, there are only six reported cases of Polycystic Kidney Disease. However, it also lists 142 cases of kidney disease, some of which may also have been PKD. Of the six Berners who succumbed to this disease, none lived past the age of 22 months

The exact causes for renal cysts are not precisely known, but genetic, environmental, and endogenous factors (originating internally) appear to influence the development of this disease.

Renal cysts may be filled with air, fluid, or semi-solid material. They develop in preexisting nephrons (the functional filtering cells of the kidney tissue) and collecting ducts which will invariably infect both kidneys. The cysts start out small and develop in size and number over time. Renal cysts are not painful, but as the disease progresses, the secondary infections associated with the cysts will become lifethreatening and cause your dog discomfort.

If not treated early to prevent cyst progression, the secondary stages lead to bacterial infections and sepsis (pus-forming toxic organisms in the blood). The enlarged kidneys won't be able to function normally, and progressive renal failure will occur. *****



Edison came into this world as a bright and happy puppy and bonded with me before I even knew. Every morning, he'd jump on my lap for hugs and kisses and continued this tradition until the day he died. He loved everyone and sought people out for love and affection. He was our "peacemaker" as his very presence settled conflicts in the household. He enriched our lives with profound joy.



BERNER Inc. Assists In Puppy Mill Rescue

otter's Angels Rescue and the Vermont State Police raided a house used as a puppy mill last May. Forty neglected dogs were living in squalid conditions. A veterinarian examined each dog for health and temperament; some had to be euthanized. Half of the dogs were Vizslas, the others Bernerdoodles and Berners. Potter's Angels and the Rutland Humane Society took several dogs to their shelters. BERNER, Inc. took six Berners. Cathy Estes, BMDCNV member, contacted her veterinarian, Dr. Chris Spooner, who took in three dogs at his Oxbow Veterinary Clinic. Big-hearted Dr. Spooner treated the dogs at his own expense and found adopters

among his clients. One of the Berners is vision impaired. After deep grooming another was revealed as a Bernerdoodle!

Two of the dogs BERNER, Inc. took, a bonded pair, were named "Ginny" and "Blossom" by their adopters. The third girl, "Cali", is in a foster-to-adopt home awaiting spaying (she went into heat soon after she was placed). Each Berner is recovering and adapting to life outside the horrific puppy mill. Their new families are working with them and giving them the care and love they need.

Forty neglected dogs were living in squalid conditions

It takes a village to rehabilitate puppy mill Berners. It also takes *money!* The following are typical costs for each puppy mill Berner we rehome (including dogs purchased from puppy mill breeders and surrendered to us for rehome by their owners).
