

AKC Obedience Trials

On Saturday, December 3, the BMDCNV hosted two AKC Obedience Trials at Warner Brook Training Center in Pittsford, VT. The events were chaired by Pam Eldredge and were ably stewarded by several club members including Heidi Henderson, Tressy Manning, and Jessica Moore. Mie Kingsley piloted the event as secretary extraordinaire. As a club we are so lucky to have these people.

The judge for the day was the ever-patient Elizabeth (Tibby) Chase, who adjudicated classes ranging from Utility to Beginner Novice. Six Berner teams were entered, with the rest of the entries filled by all breeds. After a tough Trial 1 in which no Bernese qualified, Trial 2 was more successful. Beth Atkinson and GCH CT Backcountry's Xcelsior CDX RN earned their first Utility leg while going Bernese High in Trial and Kate Elders and Oleka's Zycie Flora at Rosier

earned their 2nd Novice (CD) leg. A variety of legs and titles were earned by the non-Bernese exhibitors. All breed High in Trial for Trial 1 was Joan Bradley and English Cocker Spaniel Danby Pond Whitfield Lady Sophie BN RN TDX CGCA out of Novice B and High in Trial in Trial 2 was Charlene Swainamer and Golden Retriever RACH Mardovar's The Purrfect Run to My Heart CD PCD BN RM2 RAE3 AXP AJP NFP CGCA out of Open B.

Also, of note at the rally trials hosted the next day at the same site, Junior Handler Maisie Notte finished her Rally Novice title with placements with her 1.5-year-old Berner Stick House Angel's Destiny. Ann Davis and 9-month-old Snowpaw's Jania von Edelweiss earned their first Rally Novice leg as well.

Caleigh Brown, 17, of Attleboro, Massachusetts, has been awarded the 2022 American Kennel Club's Canine and Me Influential Junior Award, which honors children and young adults who are making a positive impact on the world with their dogs. Caleigh is a Junior Member of the Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America, and daughter of BMDCNV member George Brown. In recognition of her accomplishment, the Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America has awarded Caleigh a \$500 Scholarship.

2022 American Kennel Club's Canine and Me Influential Junior Award

Caleigh began her journey with dogs at the age of eight and has certified three Berners as Therapy Dogs over the years. They have all done advanced Canine Assisted Trauma Response. We featured her Berner, Teddy, and his 2021 AKC Award for Canine Excellence in last year's winter edition of the Bernerblatt; and Caleigh was one of the panelists at our 2022 Annual Meeting presentation, *Therapy Dogs* 101.

In addition to showing in the Conformation ring, she has titled her dogs in Obedience, Agility, Rally, Farm Dog, Advanced Tricks, and Therapy Work. Caleigh and her Bernese Mountain Dogs have contributed countless hours of community service. She is the president of her local dog club, a leader at the 4-H National Convention and Conference and heads her school's stress-relief therapy dog club. She looks to promote responsible dog ownership, effective dog training, and to share the impact of the canine-human bond with others.

Common Health Problems of Aging Bernese Mountain Dogs

When we are blessed with a Bernese Mountain Dog that lives beyond its 7-9 year predicted lifespan, we may be confronted with a multitude of other chronic health-related problems. Below we discuss Degenerative Myelopathy, Urinary Incontinence, Hypothyroidism, Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome, and Dental Disease from the perspectives of traditional, western medicine, holistic and alternative therapies.

Degenerative Myelopathy (DM) is an immune-mediated condition that we are seeing in increasing frequency in our Berners as they live longer. DM is characterized by weakness and in coordination in the hind end that may wax and wane or be steadily progressive. There is no cure. Hind end muscle atrophy, and fecal or urinary incontinence may be present. While the diagnosis of DM may be suspected based on clinical signs, definitive diagnosis comes, unfortunately, only with necropsy. There are tests available that will help identify carriers, at risk, as well as affected dogs. The management of DM is multi-faceted, combining exercise, diet, traditional medications, as well as vitamins and supplements. Lifestyle and management changes such as using area rugs, keeping nails short and hair between the toes trimmed and using harnesses such as a Help 'Em Up Harness for support, all help to make things more comfortable for dogs with DM.

Exercise is critical to keeping muscle tone and improving circulation. Walking and swimming are very beneficial. Swimming takes the stress off joints and improves muscle tone. Underwater treadmills offer the most

effective form of water exercise. Start an exercise program gradually, as these patients may need time to allow stressed muscles to repair. Chiropractic and acupuncture are also very beneficial.

Urinary incontinence may be seen alone or in conjunction with other diseases such as DM. Senior dogs should be checked often for urinary tract infections. This is best done with your veterinarian performing a cystocentesis, to obtain a sterile urine sample directly from the bladder. Bacteria, as well as bladder stones may be found and need to be treated as soon as possible. Urinary incontinence may also be the result of diminished innervation to the bladder, urethral sphincter incompetence, bladder, or urethral tumors or simply difficulty posturing to urinate. Antibiotics, dietary changes to dissolve crystals, urethral toning drugs such as Phenylpropanolamine or non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS) to treat bladder tumors may be prescribed. Chiropractic and acupuncture, with or without electrical stimulation are very effective for urinary incontinence. Herbals, such as wild yam are also beneficial. There are several other herbal preparations available to help maintain healthy urinary tract health.

Hypothyroidism, or under active thyroid function, is common in middle age to older dogs, and seen with relative frequency in Berners. Common signs include weight gain despite normal appetite, lethargy, poor hair coat +/- skin infections and cold intolerance. It is diagnosed with a blood test. The most comprehensive one is done at Michigan State University. Holistic treatment includes

a healthy, balanced diet, kelp as a source of iodine, Thyroid and Adrenal Glandulars and removing cruciferous vegetables and soy from the diet. The traditional approach would involve the use of synthetic thyroid hormone replacement with a drug such as Soloxine.

Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome (CDS)

has been likened to Alzheimer's disease. Common findings are changes in sleep/ wake cycles, house soiling, withdrawing from family interaction, not greeting owners when returning home and even forgetfulness. A healthy diet, fish oil, B vitamins, antioxidants and Choline may help. There are several herbal preparations that may also be useful such as Memoractiv and Neurochondria. It is very important to make lifestyle and environment changes to ensure the safety of these pets. Selegiline or Anipryl may be prescribed.

Dental Disease, including gingivitis and periodontitis are extremely common in aging pets, and can cause tooth loss, as well as chronic pain. Infections may start in the mouth and travel via the blood stream to the heart, liver, and the kidneys causing significant disease in these organs. The most notable sign of dental disease may be halitosis, or bad breath, but a look inside the mouth will reveal red inflamed gums, plaque, and tartar. Frequent brushing at home, as well as scaling by your veterinarian, will help prevent this from advancing. Dental radiographs reveal bone loss and abscesses not readily visible. Antibiotic therapy will help with the bacterial load in the mouth, and in some dogs may be administered in "pulse" fashion, with dosing at regular intervals through the month. Holistic products such as natural tooth sprays and ozonated olive oil are very effective for gingivitis. Appropriate diets, fish oils, and antioxidants are also very effective in preventing dental disease.

These are some of the more commonly seen problems in senior Bernese Mountain Dogs. If you notice something amiss with your Berner, a visit to your vet can help determine what the problem might be. Often this involves lab work, including blood and urinalysis, which should be done every six months on senior pets.
