It was a very lonely time during quarantine, I was hiking alone most days and missed having a 4 legged friend. Glenn found Michelle Larkin's post about "Brodie". After reading his bio, and hearing about the burns on his back, my heart broke for him. I knew he was going to be a challenge, but for some reason, I knew we had to do this.

We met up at Anna Tufts home (Brodie's neighbor who put his rescue in motion) with trainers Michelle Larkin, Leita Hagerman, and Casey Sugarman. I walked Brodie up and down the street. After 2-3 hours of evaluation with them, we decided to bring Brodie to our home.

The first few days, we worked with Brodie on positive touch. He was still so sensitive about being touched where his burn scars were. In only 3 days, he was dropping to the floor in front of us asking for belly rubs and dropping his head into our laps when we were sitting. After he received all his shots I started taking him hiking. It turns out, he absolutely loves it!

I then started working with a trainer "Tom Radford of Thin Blue line K-9" here in VT to help with his leash skills, his aggressiveness with other dogs, and how to properly greet strangers. Brodie has come leaps and bounds from the very scared reactive dog we picked up from Connecticut 5 months ago.

This past week, we hit another milestone. He can successfully pass by strangers on the hiking trails with no more growling or jumping, and I can walk him past other dogs with minimal reaction. This Sunday, he finished our hike while walking with a puppy!!! I let him have a 3-second greeting and he even play bowed. I didn't let him play with the puppy because of the size difference, but, in time I will let him play with other dogs. His recall is really outstanding.

Brodie has become best friends with my 85-year-old mom. They do crossword puzzles and watch TV together. He loves car rides and we finally found a harness that fits him for the convertible. This spring, we will share the pics in the BMDCNV on FB.

All I can say is that our house has paw prints on the floor, nose prints on the windows, and dog hair on the floors.....we couldn't be happier.



BERNER INC. RESCUE REPORT JUNE 2020

Issues and trends:

We faced the perennial problem of puppy mills, bad individual breeders, and online sales of puppies. The majority of our rescues have come from these sources in the past few years. Added to poorly bred Berners is the continuing trend of "Bernerdoodles," BMDs bred with an array of other breeds. Predictably, many of these dogs combine the weakest traits of all the breeds. We received calls for rehoming of Bernerdoodles, but we accept only purebred Berners and referred callers to all-breed rescues. We're hearing from our callers and from other BMD rescues that a common problem in Bernerdoodles is aggressive behavior and antisocial temperaments.

Covid-19 and rescue:

During the pandemic, we have had 3 rescue intakes. Fortunately, trusted BERNER, Inc. adopters

and club members picked up these dogs from their surrendering owners. Three members took the dogs in as fosters (soon to be adopted by these fosters). This assured us that Covid-19 safety protocols were followed.

Editor's Note: In the Fall 2020/BERNER Inc. issue on page 3 of the "Catching up with our Adopted Berners" the dog on the right standing on all fours is Nala, not Delta.

My beautiful, special boy left me suddenly on February 12th, 2021. Histiosarcoma came like a thief in the night and stole his bright light.

Romeo was my first show dog, and we were supposed to grow together in the sport of Conformation. He, however, shot past my amateur abilities as a handler very quickly. I handled him to portions of his Can CH, GCH, and Am CH, GCH but I realized that I couldn't do him justice. Lisa Gallizzo entered our life in the fall of 2015, and a beautiful team was born.

He was the #1 BMD Breed and All Breed, #20 Working Dog in Canada when he was a year old. He became the #1 BMD in breed, #2 All Breed in America when he was two years old. He was in the lineup all 4 years that he entered Westminster KC Show with 2x Select Dog and 2x AOM. Even from the young age of 7 months at the 2014 Canadian National Seiger Show, he was described as having "presence". Judges would comment "Type, Type, Type".

It is fitting that Ro left on Valentine's Day weekend. He lived up to the meaning of his name Ruba Cuori which is Italian for he steals hearts. He stole mine and will continue to live deep in my heart until the day comes that we meet again. I love you my Ro Ro forever and always.
